ABOUT THE COLLEGE

“Creativity is Knowledge”: we believe in this pronouncement by Albert Einstein, as it carries the true essence of our motto, and acts as a motivation to develop our educational institution from a dream project to reality. Government General Degree College, Singur, was set up in 2013 as a new academic institute under the Higher Education Department of West Bengal Government, as conceptualized by Hon. Chief Minister, Ms. Mamata Banerjee. It began functioning first within the premises of Mahamaya High School till our own three storied building, playgrounds, laboratories, canteen, Students' Activity Centre and other relevant infrastructure were developed subsequently at Jalaghata, close to Singur Railway Station, where the College shifted to soon after. The College is now permanently affiliated to the University of Burdwan. The University Grants Commission (UGC), Government of India has affiliated this College with “2f” and “12b” certification during 2017-18. Recently, the College has been awarded B+ grade in the first cycle of NAAC assessment in 2023.

Legend has it that the brave monarch Simhala Bijoy Singha, who overcame the dark ocean waters to found Sinhal, present day Sri Lanka, hailed from this land. Then of course, it was not called Singur but Singhapur – of which the present name is a contraction. It generated a wider movement all over Bengal and India, resulting in a change in governance in West Bengal. SALIENT FEATURES:

1. LIBRARY

- Government General Degree College, Singur has a well-equipped library with a spacious reading room and state of the art facilities.
- It serves as the hub of academic activities for students, scholars and faculty members in the pursuit of excellence in their respective area of academics.
- The Library has a rich and growing collection of around 7000 books and journals, including some rare and priceless ones.
- Around 500 new books are added every year.
- The college has also arranged for an Institutional membership with the British Council Library, Kolkata.
- The College is a registered member of N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content), a programme funded by the MHRD under NME-ICT. This aids the college to get access to some select electronic resources, thereby helping to procure articles and books online for purposes of teaching, learning, and research.

2. LABORATORY

- With the support from the government, the laboratories of this college are rapidly turning into extremely well-equipped facilities for running practical courses and also for research purposes.
- The students are always encouraged to nurture their skills in the laboratory under the expert guidance of the faculty members.

3. SMART CLASSROOM

- Smart class is an educational innovation steadily gaining popularity in the modern times. Smart Classrooms are technology enhanced classrooms that foster opportunities for teaching and learning by integrating learning technology, such as computer, specialized software, audience response technology, assistive listening devices, networking and, audio-visual facilities.
- Our college building is equipped with two such smart classrooms.
- Engaging lecture demonstrations made possible in these smart classrooms help to garner student attention and develop their passion for their subject of choice.

4. SEMINAR HALL

- Apart from regular classes, our college regularly organizes seminars where eminent scholars from diverse backgrounds are invited to present their valuable insights, observations and share their views and opinions with the students and the faculty members of the college.
- An air-conditioned Seminar Hall, situated at the first floor of the college building, is dedicated for this purpose.
- Academic Talks, Quizzes, Workshops, and Cultural Programmes are organized here on a regular basis.

5. COMMON ROOM

- Common room is another attraction where students come in between classes for recreation.
- There are separate common rooms for boys and girls, equipped with indoor games facilities such as carrom and table tennis boards.
- Outdoor games equipments are also available for the students.

6. CANTEEN

- One centralized canteen in a separate building is located within the college premises.
- The canteen remains open during the college hours on all working days.
- Canteen sub-committee scrutinizes the quality and price of food items to ensure that proper standards of hygiene and affordability are maintained at all times.

7. GUARDIAN- TEACHER MEETING

- These meetings are organized to keep guardians apprised of the performance and development of their wards on a regular basis.
- It also serves as a platform for the college administration to receive feedback necessary for the progress of the institution.

8. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

- Complaints and suggestions in public interest regarding the college maybe sent either by post or via email.
- A drop box is also located at the main building for this purpose.

9. INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

- This committee is established to check the overall atmosphere in the college and undertakes necessary counseling to prevent any unforeseen incidents relating to sexual harassment.
- It is within the jurisdiction of committee to take necessary action for such incidents.

10. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

- The IQAC cell monitors the overall development programme of the college.
- It takes an active role in the academic and administrative affairs of the college by discerning possible areas of weakness and providing positive suggestions to the administration for overcoming the same.

- It also prepares future projects to be undertaken by the college and plays a pivotal role in sustaining and improving institutional quality.

11. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

- The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit has started functioning from 22.09.2016, affiliated to the University of Burdwan.
- The unit has been able to enroll one hundred NSS Volunteers in its very first year and the number of registered NSS volunteers is steadily growing with each passing year.
- Every year, the Unit actively organises a number of events like NSS Day, World AIDS Day, Swami Vivekananda's Birthday Celebration, Earth Day, Thalassaemia and Dengue awareness programmes, amongst others.
- Our college unit is devoted to work hard and establish it as one of the best emerging NSS Units among its class.
- We invite the entire group of new entrants to this institution to join the NSS and continue our prestigious tradition in the field of Extension activities.

12. AWARDS AND FELLOWSHIP

SCHOLARSHIPS

- The College offers several State and Central government sponsored scholarships to the students and provides access to all necessary financial support schemes to the learners.
- The learners are guided to avail the scholarships they are eligible for during the period of their study in the college. The College has set up a dedicated Sub-Committee to look into the application, processing, and proper disbursement of scholarships for adequate financial support of the students.
- Some of the scholarships availed by the students include: Kanyashree Prokolpo Scheme, Merit-cum-Means Scholarship, Post-Matric Scholarship (for minority SC, ST and OBC students), INSPIRE Scholarship, Student Credit Card Scheme etc.
- Several other scholarships such as Aikyashree, NSP, Central Sanskrit Scholarship, Scholarship for Divyangjan students, Chief Minister's Relief Fund, and private scholarship plans like Jindal, G.P.Birla, are all offered to the students of the college.
- The Scholarship committee of the college comprising of experienced faculty members and office staff help to spread awareness among students regarding the various scholarship

plans, and monitor, verify and ensure the smooth processing of scholarship applications.

- The College has also its own Kanyashree Club, functioning regularly since 2017. Recipients of the Kanyashree Prokolpo Scheme are its active members.

FINAL SEMESTER RESULTS FROM LAST ACADEMIC SESSION (2022-2023)

Government General Degree College, Singur boasts of an increasingly impressive academic performance over the past few years. Since 2019, majority of the students appearing in the sixth semester examinations have gone on to secure first class marks, with some departments registering a 100% record in that regard. Also, the number of unsuccessful candidates has been remarkably low. The table below shows the summary of final semester results for the academic year 2022-23:

UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

The State Education Policy 2023 for West Bengal was approved by the State Cabinet on August 7, 2023, and many of the recommendations are in line with those suggested by the National Education Policy for Higher Education, 2020. In keeping with this new policy, the four-year undergraduate programme started from the academic session of 2023-24. This new education policy in West Bengal also proposed that all state colleges would now be registered under the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC).

The National Education Policy 2020 for higher education aims to transform the existing higher education system in India in order to enhance the learning outcomes of students. It intends to promote interdisciplinary studies, while also providing for flexibility in courses and fresh opportunities for students. It aims to increase the existing Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in higher education, provide multiple entry and exit options in this four-year multidisciplinary undergraduate degree, and allow students to choose courses according to their interests, aptitudes, and changing needs of the day. Students would also be able to pursue multiple degrees or programs simultaneously.

According to the NEP, undergraduate students will now have the opportunity to choose from several exit points in their program. For instance, a student may decide to leave after the first year, earning a certificate. If they leave after the second year, they will receive an Undergraduate Diploma for completing two years of study. Completing the third year will result in a Bachelor's Degree, while the fourth year will merit a recognition of a Bachelor's of Research. However, willingness to exit from the course must be announced by the student at the beginning of the semester and shall only be granted subject to the fulfillment of a few other terms and conditions.

Students at the undergraduate level shall now be able to choose a Major course of their choice from amongst the list of subjects available at the College, viz., English, Bengali, History, Sanskrit, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Santhali, Zoology, Botany, Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Computer Science, and Anthropology.

Alongside the Major Course, they shall also have to take up Minor, Multidisciplinary, Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement, Common Value Added, Summer Internship courses and Research Project or Dissertation from amidst the subjects offered by the college.

Our college continues to offer Honours courses to existing students of the Second and Third Year of UG studies in the above mentioned 16 subjects. Kindly note that Psychology Honours offers both B.A. and B.Sc. degrees as options that the students may choose to pursue at the undergraduate level. Also note that no General Course is offered in this college.



ADMISSION

Government General Degree College, Singur, welcomes students for four year Undergraduate courses in both Arts and Science streams with an array of Major subjects to choose from. Interested candidates are requested to visit the college website www.singurgovtcollege.org for further details and instructions. The online application process starts soon after publication of Higher Secondary (10+2) results by major boards of higher secondary education. Successful students hailing from higher secondary boards recognized by University of Burdwan, are eligible to apply, if they have 45% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in their desired Major subject (relaxation for reserved candidates is available as per rule). The merit list is published on the college website as well as the college notice board.

KINDLY NOTE:

- 1) Admission is granted only to deserving candidates strictly on the basis of merit score.
- 2) Issuance and successful submission of completed application forms do not guarantee admission.
- 3) The candidate is responsible for the data provided in the application form. His/her candidature will stand cancelled if any discrepancy is discovered in the information provided at any stage of the admission and even after admission.
- 4) **All admissions are PROVISIONAL until verification and registration of candidate is finalized by the University of Burdwan.** Admission of any candidate if found to be in contravention of University regulations and restrictions, or in contravention of any rule framed by the college authorities, even if detected afterwards, shall stand cancelled.

RULES OF ADMISSION:

- 5) No communication regarding admission

will be made to the candidates individually. Hence, the candidates are requested to follow the college website for important dates, notices and corrigenda.

- 6) 10+2 Pass outs only for the years 2023, 2022, 2021, and 2020 will be considered for admission.

ATTENDANCE:

- a) The college courses are run on a regular basis, which means **regular attendance is compulsory** for all registered students of the college. Every student has to ensure 90% attendance for the first 10 days after the session commences, or else the college authority has the right to cancel the admission of the concerned student.
- b) As per University rules every student must have 75% attendance in Major subject to appear in the University Examination. Any student with less than 75% attendance in lecture classes (as well as in practical classes in Science) and with less than 60% attendance in tutorial classes will be declared as Non collegiate. Such students will have to seek permission from the University of Burdwan to take the University Examinations on payment of requisite fees provided he/she has a minimum attendance of 50% in the Major stream.
- c) According to the **CBCS system of examination and evaluation that the college follows, a percentage of the marks that the students acquire as a part of his/her total marks in the university examination is based on college attendance.** If a student does not have the requisite attendance, then that will directly reflect in the marks he/she acquires in the university examinations.
- d) As per the University rules the College authority has the right to strike out a student's name from the register if

he/she is found to be absent from the college for 30 days at a stretch without notice.

- e) The College will abide by the rules put forward by University of Burdwan. Students must carry their identity cards at all times. After admission every student is required to get registered under the University of Burdwan.
- f) Loitering in the corridor/campus without any valid reason is strictly prohibited. No student is allowed to use cell-phone as well as any other electronic gadgets inside the classroom. They can only use the said devices in common room and canteen. **Student activity in the entire college is monitored through CCTV coverage**, and any student found to flout the mentioned rules will be met with due punishment from the college authorities.
- g) Students are required to attend the lectures regularly and punctually. The department can take necessary action if he/she violates this rule.
- h) Students must continue a good and cordial relationship with all the teachers, non-teaching staff and their peers of the college.
- I) Students are required to see the notice board every day for relevant information.
- j) **Students must remember smoking, drinking and spitting in the college premises are strictly forbidden in the campus.** The college authority

will take stern action if any student violates this rule.

- k) There is a disciplinary committee consisting of a group of teachers to look after the discipline amongst the students of the college.
- l) The College maintains an Internal Compliance Cell (ICC) as per UGC guidelines. This works actively towards promoting Gender Sensitization and preventing Sexual Harassment within the college campus. It undertakes necessary counseling to prevent any unforeseen incidents relating to sexual harassment, and may also initiate any necessary actions which may be prompted through the occurrence of such incidents. **The college campus promotes safety for all and strongly condemns all matters related to sexual harassment in any form to anyone within its purview.**
- m) **The college has zero tolerance towards anyone found to be involved in ragging and harassment of students within the college premises.** As per the Hon. Supreme Court and the UGC Regulations, all students of this college will have to fill in an Anti Ragging Affidavit each year.

Students of this college will have to abide by the rules, regulations, disciplinary norms and directions that may be framed from time to time by the college authority.

❖ INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY 2023

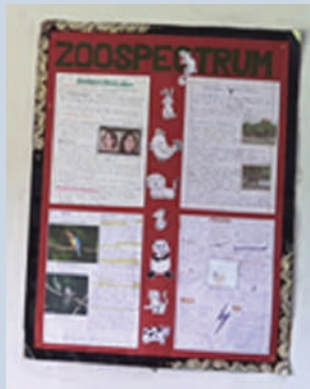

- Ten students of Sem I 2022, Department of Zoology, had spent two working days visiting two sea beaches-Frazergunj and Kalistan beach, Bakkhali, S 24 Parganas during 17th-20th February 2022. They studied bentic fauna of intertidal zone.

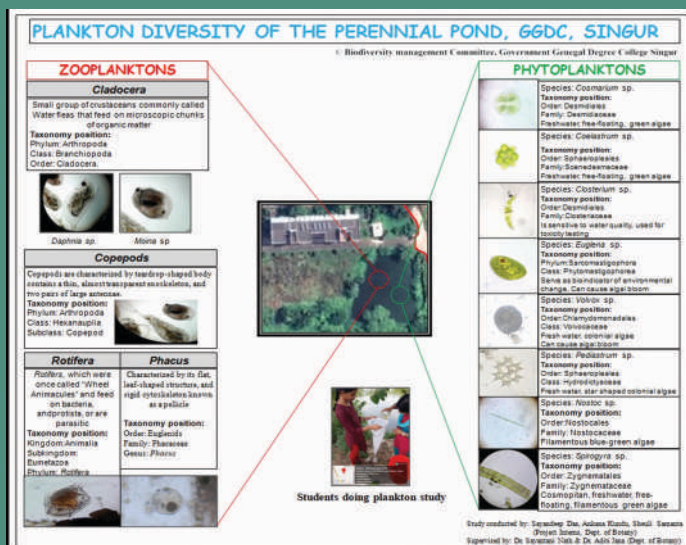

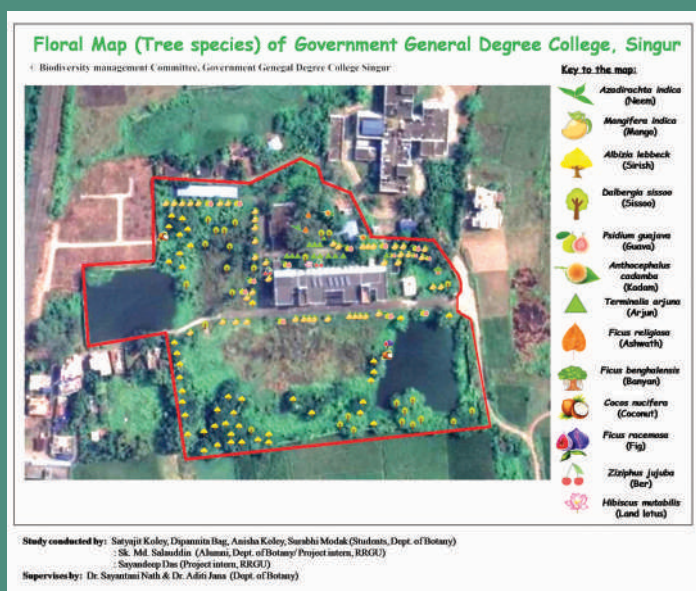

- The college maintains a canopy cover of more than 30% of the total area comprising of numerous fruit trees that serves food and shelter to local avifauna.
- Two water bodies are maintained within the college without disturbing the natural ecology and the residing periphyton. These serve as water reserves perennially harboring a rich planktonic diversity.

AWARENESS PROGRAMMES:

- Several programmes regarding Biodiversity are conducted by the college with the collaboration with Biodiversity Management Committee (BMC), BDO, Singur, Hooghly, West Bengal.
- Tree Plantation Programme 'Van mahotsav' is celebrated throughout the second week of August every year by NSS and the Department of Botany.
- The college regularly organizes student programs for planting trees and maintaining cleanliness of the campus.

ENERGY AND WATER CONSERVATION:

- **Solar panel** with the ability to generate 10000 KW of electricity has been commissioned in the College by the WBPCB & Dept. Of Energy, Govt. of West Bengal on and from 25th March, 2021.

- The college has provision for **rain water harvesting** (large tank to collect rain water and filter bed to channelize the downpour) to recharge underground water constructed and maintained in collaboration with Hooghly Zilla Parishad.
- The institution uses **LED blubs in staff room and office** for minimum power consumption

WASTE MANAGEMENT :

- **Sustainable waste disposal** - Two separate wells are prepared in the backyard of the campus to store biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste products.
- **Waste Recycling** - A MoU with Vital Waste, an organization dealing with Waste disposal, collects major solid wastes from the College from time to time.

- **Liquid waste disposal** - Liquid Wastes, mainly Chemical Wastes are kept in separate labelled containers in Chemistry, Botany & Zoology Departments which are collected periodically by *Vital Waste*.
- **E-waste disposal** - A box has been placed, especially marked for e-waste disposal in front of the College office, a generous gift (CSR) from Central Bank of India, our banker. *Vital Waste* removes them when they come to collect other wastes.

ETHICAL LABORATORY PRACTICES:

- **Hazardous chemical wastes have been labelled** and are kept in separate appropriate containers for disposal.
- **Air-conditioner effluent water** is used in routine laboratory work in place of single use distilled water by science departments like Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.
- From an ethical point of view, the **Department of Zoology strictly follows animal ethics guidelines** as stated in the syllabi of affiliating Burdwan University. Experimental animals are sacrificed following the standard protocol as prescribed by the UGC and are disposed accordingly.
- The **Department of Botany never destroys endangered and rare plants** even in their field visits. Practical work on such plants is also prohibited. Moreover, the **flora in and around the college campus is taken care of.**
- The **Department of Anthropology uses only plastic models to demonstrate human bones** and no original skeleton is kept in the department.
- The college has always functioned with a mindset to practice measures of sustainable development and will continue to do the same in the coming years.

CAREER COUNSELLING AND PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELLING

The **Career Counselling Sub-Committee** was established in the year 2021. The aim is to guide students for their future career after completion of under-graduate degree.

- In association with IQAC, GGDC Singur, the Career counselling sub-committee has been organizing several programmes that **help students to explore different paths in higher studies as well as in the field of job.** Experts from different domains have given their valuable insights to students. Students both from science and humanities stream participate in these programs actively.
- A programme of Staff Selection Commission (Eastern Region), Government of India, on the topic “Awareness Campaigning to increase its outreach so as to increase participation of more candidates in the recruitment process” was held on 28.07.2023 in the college campus. The speaker was Mr. Sanjit Kumar Roy, ASO, SSC(ER). He discussed the procedure of examination and the recruitment process of SSC. Many students have participated and benefited from such programmes.

The college has a Psychology department and a **Psychological Counselling Cell** for students, faculty members and office staff of the college.

- There is a separate session room in the college where the department also organises group sessions and individual sessions.
- The sessions are conducted by the faculty members of the Psychology department keeping the privacy of the counselee intact. All the interactions are kept strictly confidential.
- Students seeking counselling take prior appointments with the help of their departmental heads and other teachers. Counselling sessions are then scheduled as per mutual convenience, without hampering regular classes.
- As a result of continuous supervision and counselling of the students, attendance has improved and concentration has increased.

MOU WITH RANI RASHMONI GREEN UNIVERSITY

- The Principal of Government General Degree College, Singur, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Rani Rashmoni Green University (RRGU). The University was partially set up at the premises the College building.
- Classes commenced at Rani Rashmoni Green University in collaboration with Government General Degree College, Singur from 2020. At the beginning, classes began in Chemistry and Environmental Science at the Post-graduate level.
- Today, RRGU offers Masters degree courses in subjects like Chemistry, Computer Science and Environmental Science. Currently, 55 students are enrolled in the above-mentioned courses. The University had its first batch of students pass out this year (2022) with significantly good results.

NOTEWORTHY RESULTS UNDER THIS MoU:

- The post graduate Department of Chemistry at the Rani Rashmoni Green University started its journey in December, 2020 under the able leadership of Honourable Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Ashutosh Ghosh in collaboration with the Department of Chemistry, Government General Degree College, Singur as a part of the MoU. Dr. Amrit Krishna Mitra from the Department of Chemistry, Government General Degree College, Singur was appointed the 'Course Coordinator (Academic)' for the post graduate Department of Chemistry of Rani Rashmoni Green University.
- The first batch has successfully completed their M.Sc. course in Chemistry in the year 2022 and the second batch is on the verge of completing the same. Four students from the first batch have been **placed as chemists** in several industries of national repute. Students from the Department of Chemistry have been able to publish **seven research papers** in various international journals having high impact factors.

- Several students from this department have secured high ranks in **CSIR-NET** and **WB-SET** examinations. It has been a proud moment for the newly established University when students from the Department of Chemistry **got selected for Ph.D. and M.Tech.** in the prestigious organisations of our country like Indian Institute of Technology-Hyderabad (**IIT-Hyderabad**), Indian Institute of Technology-BHU (**IIT-BHU**), *Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR)*, Indian Association for the Cultivation of Science (**IACS**), **BITS-Pilani** and many others. A student from this department has also been recognised as the topper at the national level of the advanced chemistry courses organised by SWAYAM NPTEL (an initiative of MOE, GOI).

MoU WITH GOVERNMENT PHYSICAL EDUCATION COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, CHINSURAH, HOOGHLY

- A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed by and between Government General Degree College, Singur, and Government Physical Education College for Women,

Chinsurah, Hooghly, in 2018. This collaboration promotes cooperation between these two institutes of learning, making effective use of each of their resources, and providing each of them with enhanced opportunities within the areas of Higher Education, Sports, Physical Education and Skill-based training.

- The MoU provides a rare chance to the students to gain convenient access to conventional education imparted by reputed and competent faculty, as well as build physical fitness for a healthy life and holistic personality. The two colleges assist each other, in the interest of mutual benefit, to arrange classes on a regular basis, and also carry out joint activities in the fields of Sports Management, Physical Education, and allied sciences.
- Government Physical Education College for Women, Chinsurah, Hooghly, conducts all sports and games competitions organized by Government General Degree College, Singur.
- Government General Degree College, Singur, helps to train the students of Government Physical Education College for Women, Chinsurah, Hooghly, about the emerging technological trends in order to bridge the skill gap and also help develop communicative and research skills.
