COURSE OUTCOME

There are total six Semesters in the Three-Year B.A. Philosophy Honours programme. It consists of fourteen (14) Core Courses, two (2) Ability Enhancement Courses, two (2) Skill Enhancement Courses, four (4) Discipline Specific Elective Courses and four (4) Interdisciplinary Generic Elective Courses. The Outcome of these courses may be jotted down below in the tabular form-

COURSE CODE	COURSE TITLE	COURSE OUTCOME
CC- 1	Outlines of Indian Philosophy—I	This particular course covers the basic concepts of Indian Philosophy. From this course students can be learnt Cārvāka Philosophy, Jaina Philosophy, Buddhist Philosophy and Nyāya–Vaiśeṣika Philosophy.
CC- 2	Outlines of Western Philosophy—I	This course helps the students to know the basic outlines of Western Philosophy. It highlights on the Pre-socratic Philosophy, Plato, Aristotle’s philosophy and rationalism of Descartes, Spinoza and Leibniz.
GE- 1	Indian Philosophy	This Interdisciplinary Generic Elective course contains the primary thoughts of major Indian Philosophical schools like Cārvāka, Jainism, Buddhism, Nyāya–Vaiśeṣika, Sāṃkhya, Yoga, Mīmāṃsā, Advaita Vedānta.
AECC- 1	ENVS Ability Enhancement Course	This course enriches students with Environmental studies and policies for evolving our environment.
CC- 3	Outlines of Indian Philosophy-II	This course helps honours students to learn about Sāṃkhya, Yoga, Pūrva-Mīmāṃsā, Advaita Vedānta philosophy.
CC- 4	Outlines of Western Philosophy—II	Going through the course the students can acquire knowledge on the philosophy of Locke, Berkeley, Hume, Kant and Hegel.
GE- 2	Western Philosophy	This Interdisciplinary (Generic Elective) course deals with fundamental topics of western philosophy namely Metaphysics, Realism, Idealism, Theory of Causation, Theory of Substance, Relation between Mind and Body, Theories of Evolution and so on.
AECC- 2	Communicative Eng.	This Ability Enhancement course encourages students to know the skills for communicative English and related topics.
CC- 5	Indian Ethics	This course includes some basic Indian ethical theories like Puruṣārtha, Vedic ethics, Buddhist ethics of pañcaśīla and brahmavihāra, Jaina Ethics of pañcavrata:mahāvratā and anuvratā, and triratna and Yoga Ethics.
CC- 6	Western Ethics	Studying this specific course students can be knowledgeable with Nature and Scope of Ethics, Nature of Morality, Moral and Non-moral actions, Object of Moral Judgment : Motive and Intention, Postulates of Morality, The Development of Morality etc.
CC- 7	Indian Logic	This particular course is on Annāmbhatta’s Tarkasamgraha with Dīpikā annotation. Students can grasp the taste of Indian logic from this course.
GE- 3	Logic	This is another Interdisciplinary Generic Elective is for teaching students about Western Logic. With studying this course students can learn about categorical syllogism, venn diagram, truth functional arguments and other logical reasonings.
SEC- 1	Philosophy in Practice	This Skill Enhancement Course comprises Common and Differentiating Characteristics of Philosophy and darśana, Metaphysical Inquiry in Philosophy and darśana, Methods of Philosophical discourse and related topics.
CC- 8	Western Logic-I	This core course helps students to learn about propositional and predicate logic.

CC- 9	Psychology	This course is about general concept of psychology which includes topics like methods of psychology, attention, consciousness, intelligence, memory and so on.
CC- 10	Philosophy of Religion	This particular course is meant for teaching students the origin and development of religion, fundamental features of major religions, problem of evil, Monotheism etc. topics.
GE- 4	Contemporary Indian Philosophy	This Interdisciplinary (Generic Elective) course covers the philosophies of Rabindranath Tagore, Swami Vivekananda, Md. Iqbal, M.K. Gandhi and Sri Aurobindo.
SEC- 2	Philosophy of Human Rights	This Skill Enhancement Course in semester four helps students for learning Definition, nature and features of human rights, the ideal of natural law and right, preamble, fundamental rights and duties of Indian constitution.
CC- 11	Socio-Political Philosophy	This course teaches students basic concepts of social and political philosophy. It also incorporates some major theories of social and political philosophy.
CC- 12	Western Logic-II	This course encompasses inductive theories and philosophy of logic and language.
DSE- 1	Special Text:Kāthopaniṣad	This course is made for teaching students the philosophy of Kathopanisad.
DSE- 2	Special Text: B. Russell: The Problems of Philosophy	This Discipline Specific Elective course is set up for teaching students about Russell famous writing 'the Problems of Philosophy'. Studying this paper students can know some fundamental issues of Russel's thought.
CC- 13	Philosophy in the Twentieth Century: Indian	This Core Course includes philosophy of contemporary Indian thoughts of Tagore, Vivekananda, Iqbal, Gandhi and Aurobindo.
CC- 14	Philosophy in the Twentieth Century: Western	This particular course helps students to comprehend the philosophies of G.E. Moore, B. Russell, L. Wittgenstein, A.J. Ayer, M. Heidegger and J.P. Sartre.
DSE- 3	Special Text: Rabindranath Tagore: Sadhana	This Discipline Specific Elective course inspires students to understand the philosophical thought inherited in Sadhana, the famous philosophical writings of Rabindranath Tagore.
DSE- 4	Special Text: Hume: An Enquiry Concerning Human Understanding	This is another Discipline Specific Elective in the sixth semester which deals with Hume's Enquiry and assists students to make out empiricist philosophy of David Hume.
